Why should you remove carcasses?

- Significant attractants to Grizzly Bears and other predators
- Carcasses increase bear presence near humans and homes
- Carcasses attract Grizzly Bears to living livestock nearby
- Boneyards create bears that are habituated to feeding on livestock
